Levels of entry for incoming artwork:

Professional Selling artwork **or** teaching art classes

Masters Being in previous Masters Level category **or** won Best of Show

Categories within Levels:

Landscape, seascape, cityscape

Floral/Still Life Animals/Birds, etc.

Abstract/Collage/Mixed Media

Portraits and Figures

Judge's Choice and People's Choice ribbons will also be awarded

Other important information:

- Artwork must be original, done within the last 2 years and not previously entered in any PVA show.
- Artwork must be properly framed and wired for easy hanging. No saw tooth hangers.
- All sales will be run through the Sales Cashier. The club will garner 10% commission plus AZ Sale Tax.
- All artwork must be picked up between 3:30 and 4 p.m. on March 15
- A Plus-One may accompany you to the artist reception on March 13.

Gift Shop Information

Palo Verde Gift Shop is separate but included in the Art Show and Sale.

Members may sell small wares they have created which meet category rules and regulations.

You must have artwork in the show to be eligible for the gift shop.

Acceptable Gift Shop Categories—all items must have a tag with your initials and a price

* Handcrafted Jewelry Earrings, Necklaces, Bracelets, etc.

* Framed Original Artwork Framed no larger than 8 x 10

* Unframed Original Artwork Must be matted and in cello envelope, complying with 8 x 10 standard

* Greeting Cards Must be in a cello envelope

* Prints Must be matted and in cello envelope

Maximum size is 11 x 14 matted. You may bring your own bin.

Gift Shop Rules and Regulations:

- Gift shop participants must present an inventory list of their items to the gift shop manager at check in.
- Each gift shop item must be marked with your unique code consisting of 3 initials and a number.
- The Gift Shop will be set up by Gift Shop Volunteers under the direction of the Manager.
- Each participant will be allowed up to 40 pieces on display at one time.
- All sales will be run through the Sales Cashier. The club will garner 10% commission plus AZ Sale Tax.

A Companion for Life and Art



Whatever their purpose may be, dogs are loved all over the world. Dogs represented love, loyalty and fidelity from ancient times, especially those from the Renaissance, and acted as symbols of devotional relationships in many paintings throughout history. The inclusion of dogs in portraits can reveal the relationships between people and animals, as well as the social dynamics of the time.

There are illustrations of dogs on the walls of tombs dating back to the Bronze Age, as well as statues, children's toys, and ceramics depicting dogs. One of the prehistoric paintings estimated to be 9,000 years old found at the Bhimbetka rock shelters in India depict a dog held on a leash by a man. Hunting scenes were popular in the Middle Ages and the Renaissance and were depicted to symbolize guidance, protection, loyalty, fidelity, faithfulness, alertness, and love.

As dogs became more domesticated, they were shown as companion animals, often painted sitting on a lady's lap. Throughout art history, mainly in Western art, there is an overwhelming presence of dogs as status symbols and pets in painting. They were cherished as part of the family, and were regarded highly by the upper classes, who used them for hunting and would signal status. After the establishment of The Kennel Club in the UK in 1873 and the American Kennel Club in 1884, breed standards, or "word pictures," were introduced, and dog portraits soared in popularity. One of the most amusing use of them as subject matter is probably the series painted by an American artist, Cassius Marcellus Coolidge, mainly known for his series of portraits Dogs Playing Poker which became illustrations for selling cigars.

Modern artists like Pablo Picasso and Jeff Koons also frequently included canine companions in their works, in concert with the value placed on them as pets in today's society, where they are often treated almost as children, adorned with costumes and riding in a stroller!

















Marlene Bonneville March 2025 Artist of the Month

Marlene Bonneville is Artist of the Month for March 2025 at Palo Verde Artists. As natives of Minnesota, she and her husband raised their children there and eventually moved to Arizona in 1982. They settled in Scottsdale where she taught oil painting classes in Adult Education programs for her school district, plus numerous classes for other groups.

Basically self-taught, she earned degrees in CADD (computer art and design) and Graphic Design. She was an instructor at a graphic design school for 11 years before moving first to the West Valley in 1999 and eventually to Sun City in 2004. She has enjoyed doing art since childhood as do a niece, granddaughters, and her ten-year-old great granddaughter who is very creative.

Bonneville enjoys working in all mediums including: charcoal and graphite, pencil, colored pencil, pen and ink, watercolor and acrylics. She says, "I think it's good to try different mediums because it expands your artistic knowledge. You never know what you can do until you try it."

Two of her favorite artists are Georgia O'Keeffe and Normal Rockwell. Her favorite picture that she has painted is named The Good Shepherd. Bonneville loves to paint many different things but she loves best painting animals of all kinds. She has won many ribbons for her work and even the People's Choice at an art show.

Bonneville is a past member of the Jaques Art Center in Minnesota and the Scottsdale Artists Club, and is a current member of Palo Verde Artists and Artists by the Lake, of Sun City, AZ. She is currently teaching watercolors at Artists by the Lake.

Marlene's artwork will be on display for the entire month of March in the showcase outside the PVA club room.
